Approximately 13 years ago, I was a rabbinic student looking forward to being ordained as a rabbi. I was looking for a congregation that would be the best match for my skills and personality. Like some of my classmates, I thought that perhaps I would start my career as an assistant rabbi in a large congregation. It was my father (z'l)

I look forward to thinking about what we can continue to do here at Temple, here in Rockford and in the wider world to enrich our lives with the Jewish values of Torah (study), Avodah (worship) and Gemilut Chasadim (deeds of loving kindness). Special thanks are due to Jim Gesmer, Sharon Goldsand, Brina Grigg, Jerry Grubb, Barbara Holmstrom, Jerry Paris and especially Jay Sklar who chaired the committee for the many hours they worked in order to hammer out the details. Jay and his committee were

very accommodating and easy to work with. The whole process, which in every congregation has the potential to be unpleasant, was perfectly enjoyable. Thank you all.

My new contract begins in July of 2015 and ends in June of 2020! When I think about the year 2020, on some level, it seems very far off. In truth, as time usually does, it will pass very quickly. Sometimes, I try and imagine what my life will be like in the future. Of course, no one has a crystal ball and there are always unexpected changes but still, it's fun to use a milestone like this to imagine the future. Five years from now, God willing (I

don't believe in a deity who wills the future but perhaps I'm superstitious enough to put this before my musings...): Shlomo and I will have been married for almost 20 years, Lilly will have celebrated her bat mitzvah and be finishing her freshman year at Guilford, Dana will be the age that Lilly is now - finishing 4<sup>th</sup> Grade. The Temple board met on March, 11th, 2015. Rabbi opened with a prayer from the morning liturgy that asks God to give us a healthy body so we can

The board voted to accept proxy votes to be counted in the quorum at the annual Temple meeting. A nominating committee for next year's board is being formed and headed by Jay Sklar. The safety committee is still working on keeping our congregation safe. Jay said that he is looking into surveillance through our alarm company, that the county Sheriff will be looking at our building and Com-Ed is looking at our lighting.

Rabbi reported on what kept her busy. Some highlights included working at the 5th-6th OSRUI retreat, attending a Kallah in Arizona, working with GRTY on their Shabbat service and officiating at two funerals. The finance committee is still working on having the Temple audited some time this year. They are waiting on a few more bids.

The Temple Passover Seder will be held on Saturday April 4th. The cost will be the same as last year. \$20 for adults, \$10 for children and no more than \$50 for a family.

The Sunday school children have been busy making Mandelbrot, Tu'Beshevat trees, celebrating Purim and participating in Good Deeds Day.

GRTY led a wonderful Friday Shabbat Service with members of Healing Pathways attending along with the congregation. All their fundraising efforts benefited Healing Pathways. GRTY also helped with the Purim Carnival and will be helping set up and take down the rummage sale.

Food-a-Rama is approaching. Karen and Sara have sent letters to businesses asking for ads for our brochure. Joyce will put a post about Food-a-Rama on Craig's list. If you have a Facebook page, please put a post about Food-a-Rama on your site.

As you read this we have crossed the border into April with a miserable winter still fresh in our memories. I don't know about you, but many times I thought

it would be great to be in the Caribbean and away from the cold and snow. I'm sure I could even go to Shabbat services almost anywhere. I asked myself what it would be like to be president in a synagogue or temple in Puerto Rico, or Curacao.

I have been fortunate enough to visit Mikve Israel-Emanuel Synagogue in Curacao. This synagogue was founded in 1732 and is believed to be the oldest operating synagogue in the Western Hemisphere. It has sand on the floor and beautiful candelabras hanging from the ceilings.

Hadassah Magazine had an article about two congregations and a Jewish Community Center in Puerto Rico. A newspaper article titled "Jamaica Reaches Out to Bring in Jewish Tourists" was in a Florida newspaper. The island once was home to 2,500 Jews in the 1800's but today only about 200 remain. There were once eight synagogues and now most members are in their 50's and trying to preserve their Jewish History. There also remains a tiny Jewish Community in St. Thomas in the U.S. Virgin Islands. So you could enjoy the sun, beaches, shopping and Judaism as well.

It seems to me that even in such desirable climates the challenges of operating and maintaining our Jewish communities and Temples are the same. I think being President there might be very similar to being president here.

Here, we have our veteran Rabbi to lead us for another five years. We are fortunate to have wonderful members here, many very dedicated volunteers that we could not do without. We have just completed a very successful Rummage Sale. We are deep into work on Food-A-Rama. Our Youth did a service that can only be called inspiring. Watching 23 young adults take on projects and responsibility was spellbinding for the over 100 people present.

The Caribbean or Rockford Illinois? I think I will stay right here (except for occasional visits, I hope) because our congregation is first rate. ## Featured Speaker Doris Fogel

Doris (Warschawski) Fogel, at the age of four, and her mother left Berlin in 1939. They arrived as "Stateless Refugees" in Shanghai, China. She spent the next eight (8) years in the Hongkew Ghetto living in internment camps (Heime) among the starving Chinese citizenry, in a city without benefit of running water and modern sanitation facilities. Through the incredible work of the JDC (Joint Distribution Committee) representatives, including Laura Margolis, they and nearly 20,000 thousand Jews were fed and cared for as they "existed" in the Hongkew ghetto throughout the Japanese occupation of Shanghai for the balance of the war.

Cakes and pies usually sell for \$5-\$10. Cookies by half dozen sell for about \$2-\$3. **Bakery Ideas**: (Include some smaller portions for singles; for example, half a cake. Bar cookies (toffee, brownies, strudel, lemon bars, butterscotch, etc.)

Coffee cakes (sour cream, cinnamon, pecan, etc.)

Cookies (chocolate chip, peanut butter, Mandelbrot, rugelach)

Cakes (chocolate, sponge, Bundt, poppy seed, carrot, pound, etc.)

Pies (cheese, fruit, pecan)

Breads/Muffins/Rolls: Any specialty you may have!

You could bake items from our cookbook. Identify the recipe and list the page number on the label.

Label each package clearly and in detail so we know exactly what the item is. The Board of health is requiring a list of ingredients (recipe not required).

**Packaging:** Make each package look pretty so it sells quickly. Foil pans enclosed in clear plastic baggies, tied with a twist or colored ribbon look attractive. Ask the butcher at your favorite store for some Styrofoam trays or keep the small plastic containers from purchased rolls or cookies.

**Cakes and Pies** can be lightly covered with plastic wrap since we put them in boxes when they are sold. **Breads** should be wrapped in clear plastic so they can be seen.

#### Where and When to Deliver Baked Goods

Bring your items to the Temple on Tuesday, May 19th, the day before Food-A-Rama. Sign in at the bakery table. Leave your name and what you brought.

If you cannot provide baked goods, we ask you to make a \$25 donation, but we hope you will bake since the community really looks forward to a full bakery table.
