While it is certainly a lot of work, our Temple community benefits by experiencing the joy of coming together in support of our traditions, our beautiful Temple and the Jewish people.

Many of us remember the similar feeling we had during our 100th anniversary celebration a couple of years ago. One part that we especially enjoyed was having a couple of Temple sponsored cultural events in the Rockford community. One such event was a Jewish-themed play at the Artist Ensemble Theater called "Brooklyn Boy." Many of us went to see that play. It was refreshing to see a work that we could especially connect with as Jews.

Well, this month, in addition to all of FAR connecting us to our heritage, we will have another opportunity to see a play with a Jewish flavor. Artists' Ensemble is presenting the play, "Visiting Mr. Green," by Jeff Baron. The play is about a young Jewish man who is court-ordered, because of a car accident, to make weekly visits to the older Orthodox Jewish man who he almost hit. The play has humor and many heartfelt moments.

While we didn't have the opportunity to be a

sponsor for the play, Jay Sklar and I have been consulting with them and even attended the first reading to help with language pronunciation and understanding of Jewish customs. There is a flyer with the play schedule further in the bulletin, and I encourage you to attend one of the many shows taking place during the month. If you go to the 4pm show on the 7th or the 2pm show on the 8th, come about 45 minutes early as there will be a talk by the director about the play.

But wait! There's more! On Sunday morning, May 22nd at 10am, our adult education will be focused on this play, so it will be even more important for you to try to see the play in advance. The director, Richard Raether, as well as, we hope, the two cast members will join us to discuss the play and give us a chance to interact with its message on a deeper level. This is a very exciting opportunity, and I hope you will take advantage of it by attending the play and then attending the adult education on May 22nd.

One more event to make sure is on your calendar this month – Confirmation! Please do plan on attending the Shabbat Services on Friday night, May 20th at 7:30 during which 7(!) of our young adults will celebrate their Confirmation. These students – Lauren Bear, Natalie Deutsch, Jenna Glassman, Adam Gesmer, Zachary Hergert, Ben Kopnick and Jamie Zussman – have been studying and learning about Judaism for many years and now we celebrate their completion of their formal Jewish education. Though we know they will continue to learn about Judaism throughout their lives (ask them about the Jewish Literacy Quiz we took at the end!), we want to mark this milestone with the congregation. We have had a great year studying together, and we look forward to having the congregation present as they confirm their Jewish identities. We'll also be joined by our wonderful soloist, Cindy Michelassi, so the music is sure to be beautiful as well. Please do plan on attending.

The Temple Board met on April 13th, 2016. Mary Roufa based her D'Var Torah on the Torah portion M'tzora, Leviticus 14:1-15:33. This portion interested her because she

finished a class on Catholic theology. It seems that most Christians believe that the body and soul are separate while most Jews believe the body and soul are one. Of course, each religion has many different perspectives on this. Mary sees this as an important issue for children. She sees teens that are preoccupied with their bodies and forget about their souls and she also sees teens that are so studious that they forget about their bodies.

Brina reported that the adult education committee has added another program to our calendar, which will be held on November 13th in the morning.

Other than her usual duties, the Rabbi reported that she is working with the GRTY youth to get ready for their Friday night service. She officiated at Josh Zussman's Bar Mitzvah and attended the shiva for Howard Morris's mother. She made blintzes and welcomed the Westminster Presbyterian Confirmation Class. The Rabbi asked the board to approve the Transform Rockford Values. The board voted to confirm the values, so our name will be added.

Rob reported that, although we have some cash on hand, there has been a significant drop. If the Rummage Sale and Food-A-Rama come close to making what was budgeted, we should be covered until the end of the year. He is still working on a proposed budget for next year which will be presented at the annual Temple meeting.

The Foundation did better in March with a 5.5% gain, but our net over principle for the year is still negative. After talking to Savant, our funds are in a Schwab account and are going in the right direction.

The Purim service and carnival went well. Everyone had a good time. Our Passover Seder will be on Saturday April 23rd, the second night of Passover. There will be no services on Friday April 22nd.

Lauren reported that the Religious school students have been bringing peanut butter jars as part of their Good Deeds Day Celebration. These jars will be donated to Backpack Buddies. GRTY has been writing and practicing for their service which will be on April 29th at 7:30. They went on their Chicago trip where they started with a photo-op at The Bean, went shopping at Water Tower or played games at Dave and Busters. They had a pizza dinner at Home Run Inn and finished the day at the Comedy Sportz Theatre. Some of the youth group will be helping at the rummage sale.

Our new refrigerator will be arriving on Tuesday and will be in time for Food-A-Rama. Everything is running smoothly. The blintzes have all been made.

Jay Sklar presented the board with the nominating committee's recommendation for next year's officers, and the board voted to approve the slate. Each family unit will have two votes at the annual meeting. Jay also brought us up to date on the security system.

Our next Temple Beth-El get together will be at the Huss home on June 11th.


Principal Pekarsky spoke to the classes regarding age appropriate issues related to the Holocaust. We had a reading of the book Brundibar by Mrs.



54th ANNUAL FOOD-A-RAMA—Wednesday, May 18th, 2016

The first four letters of "delicious" spell "Deli"—as in Delicious Delicatessen style lunches made from corned beef and breads imported straight from Chicago and assembled by scores of super volunteers from the Temple Beth-El Family for the Rockford community.

New This Year

We are adding Turkey Pastrami to our sandwich offering both on the buffet and for delivery. For those not red meat fans, this is a tantalizing option we are sure will meet with great acceptance. We tested it on the buffet last year, and they went like hot cakes. Spread the word. Turkey Pastrami is now a full option.

FAR will be from 10-7:00pm with lunch buffet from 10-1:30pm

Each delivery lunch contains a generous quarter pound corned beef sandwich on rye OR Turkey Pastrami sandwich on rye bread, a kosher-style pickle, potato chips and a generous piece of mandelbrot. Dine-in and receive sides of cole slaw and our famous baked beans. And that's not all. In addition to the lunches, the Temple sells all kinds of Jewish specialty foods—from pies, cakes and cookies (baked by YOU) to blintzes, chopped liver, pastrami, herring and much, much more.

FOOD-A-RAMA WORKERS WANTED

In the next few weeks you will receive an email from Wendy Huss asking you to volunteer to help. It is through "sign-up genius" a software that allows us to keep better track, send out reminders etc. It is safe to use, and if you have any questions, please contact Wendy Huss. Do you like to drive? We need delivery people. Like to bake? The bakery is a crucial part of Food-A-Rama, and we need bakers. Got muscle? We always need help with set-up and take down. How are you at packing pickles? Bagging cookies? Assembling pre-orders? Could you be a sponsor? We have a job for nearly every skill. So answer your email or call Wendy and be a part of Temple's largest fundraiser. Just say YES!

PREORDERS FOR TEMPLE MEMBERS

Pick-up after 1:00 pm, Tues., May 17th, the day before FAR

One of the most important purposes of Food-A-Rama is to open our Temple to the Rockford community and share our gastronomic delights with them, but we want to be able to purchase those goodies, too. You will be receiving an order form with a list of Food-A-Rama foods and their prices. Fill it out and return it to the Temple if you want to preorder these goodies and reserve them for your family.

FOOD-A-RAMA TICKET SALES

Soon, you'll be getting seven tickets to FAR in the mail. Please sell them. The price is \$11.00 each, and the lunch is worth every penny. Remember, Turkey Pastrami is now an option, too! Call the Temple office if you need more tickets. Please do not get them from other Temple members, as it confuses the records. And please send in the ticket money as soon as possible.

BEAUTIFUL BAKED GOODS FOR FOOD-A-RAMA

Each Temple family is asked to bake something to sell in the Food-A-Rama bakery. You can bake cakes, strudels, cookies, pies, breads, whatever you like and as many items as you like. Cakes and pies usually sell for \$5-\$10. Cookies by half dozen sell for about \$2-\$3. Bakery Ideas: (Include some smaller portions for singles; for example, half a cake. Bar cookies (toffee, brownies, strudel, lemon bars, butterscotch, etc.)

Coffee cakes (sour cream, cinnamon, pecan, etc.) Cookies (chocolate chip, peanut butter, Mandelbrot, rugelach) Cakes (chocolate, sponge, Bundt, poppy seed, carrot, pound, etc.) Pies (cheese, fruit, pecan) Breads/Muffins/Rolls: Any specialty you may have!

Here's an idea.... You could bake items from our cookbook. Identify the recipe and list the page number on the label.

Label each package clearly and in detail so we know exactly what the item is. The Board of health is requiring a list of ingredients (recipe not required).

Packaging: Make each package look pretty so it sells quickly. Foil pans enclosed in clear plastic baggies, tied with a twist or colored ribbon look attractive. Ask the butcher at your favorite store for some Styrofoam trays or keep the small plastic containers from purchased rolls or cookies. **Cakes and Pies** can be lightly covered with plastic wrap since we put them in boxes when they are sold. **Breads** should be wrapped in clear plastic so they can be seen.

Where and When to Deliver Baked Goods

Bring your items to the Temple on Tuesday, May 17th, the day before Food-A-Rama. Sign in at the bakery table. Leave your name and what you brought.

If you cannot provide baked goods, we ask you to make a \$25 donation, but we hope you will bake since the community really looks forward to a full bakery table. They really do look forward to your goodies!




